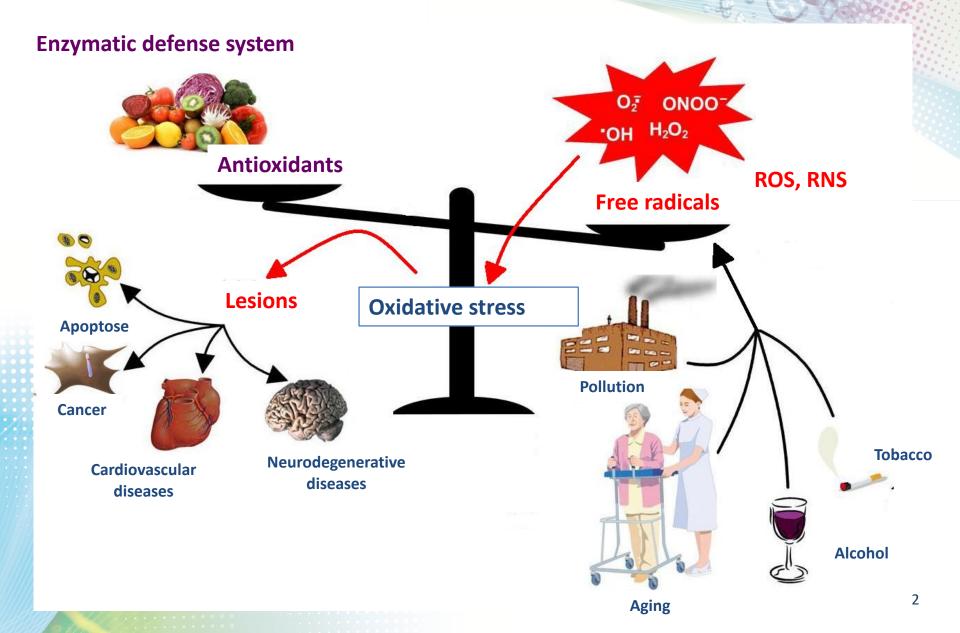

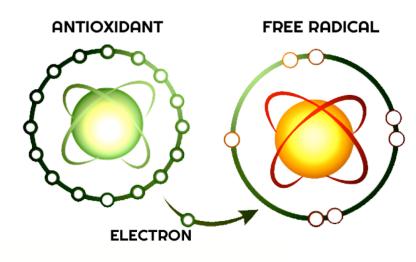

### Introduction: oxidative balance



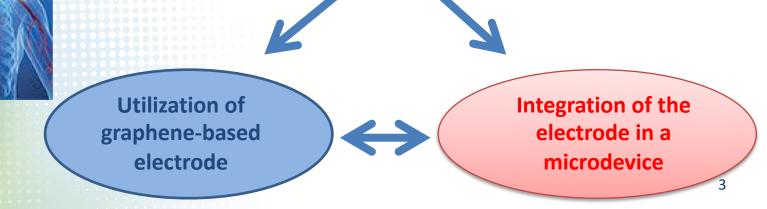
# **Objectives / Strategy**



→ Electrochemical biosensors

Glassy carbon → no compatible with Si microtechnologies for large scale production of microsensors

Functionalized electrode  $\rightarrow$  life-time, sensitivity, selectivity, limit of detection



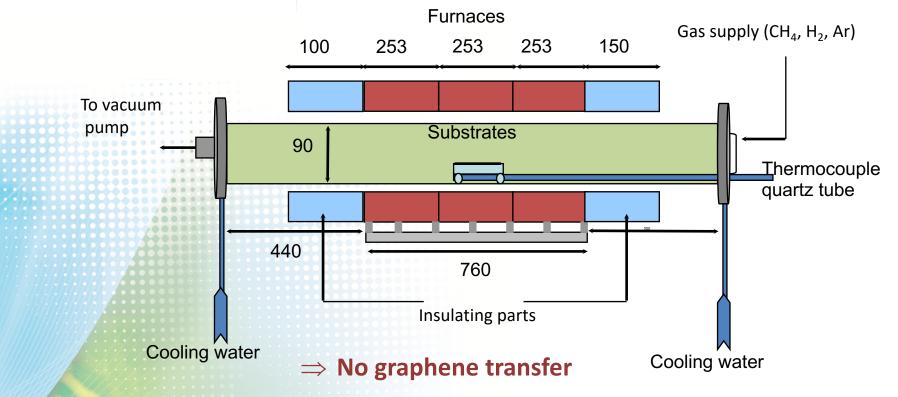
# **Catalytic CVD**

#### Graphene deposition parameters:

- Pt catalyst
- $T = 1040^{\circ}C$
- Atmospheric pressure
- Carbon feedstock: CH<sub>4</sub>
- Thermal pretreatment
- Reductive H<sub>2</sub> atmosphere

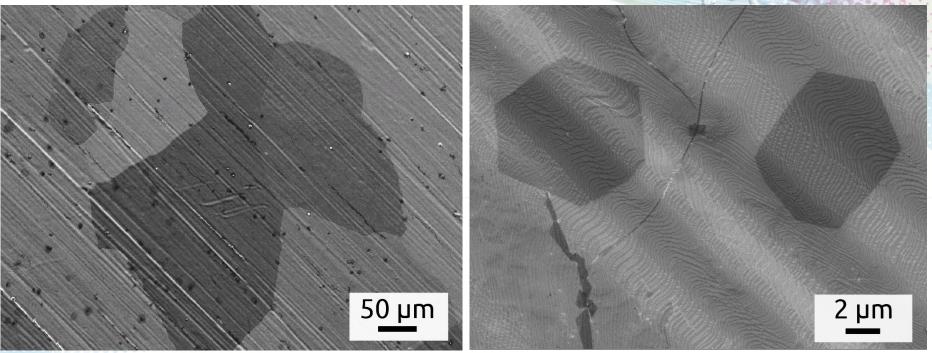

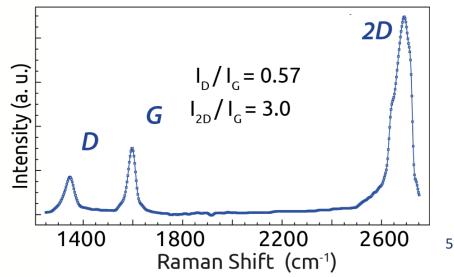
# **Graphene / Pt foil**





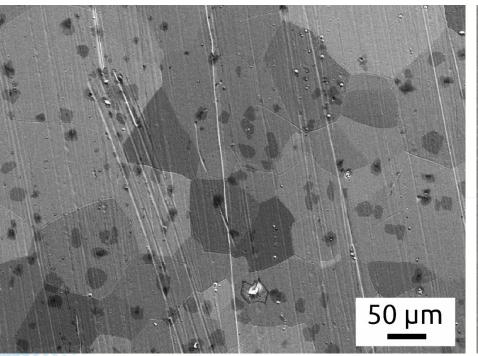
#### Parameters:

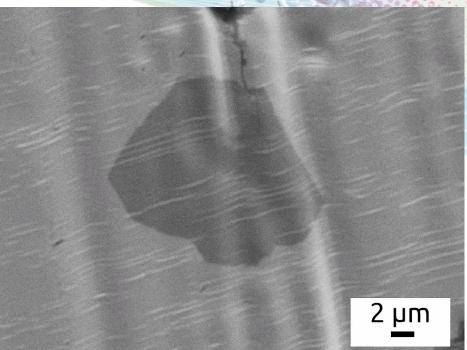
- Pt foil (100-μm thick)
- Thermal pretreatment: 15 min
- Deposition duration: 12 min
- CH<sub>4</sub>: 5 sccm



# **Graphene / Pt foil**

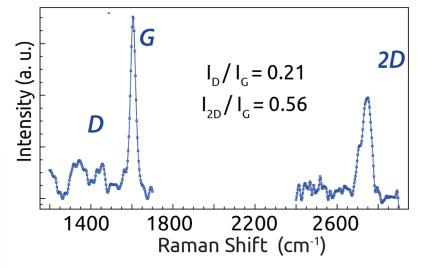






#### • Parameters:

- Pt foil (100-μm thick)

- CH<sub>4</sub>: 5 sccm

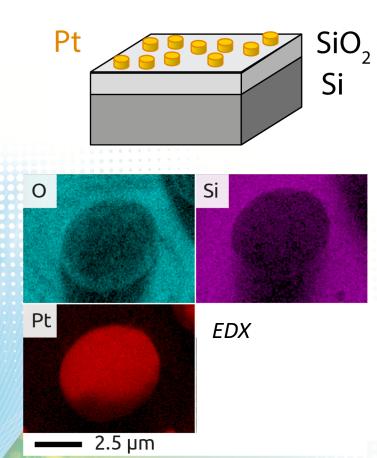

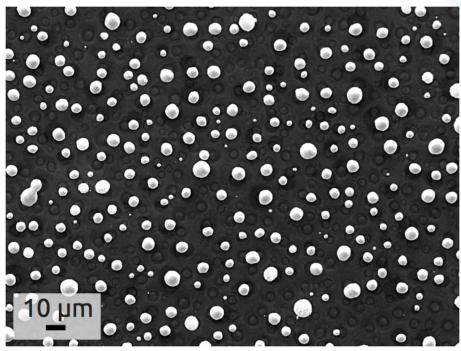
# Pt thin films

#### • Parameters:

- Pt (200 nm) / SiO<sub>2</sub>-Si
- Thermal pretreatment: 15 min
- Deposition duration: 12 min
- CH<sub>4</sub>: 5 sccm



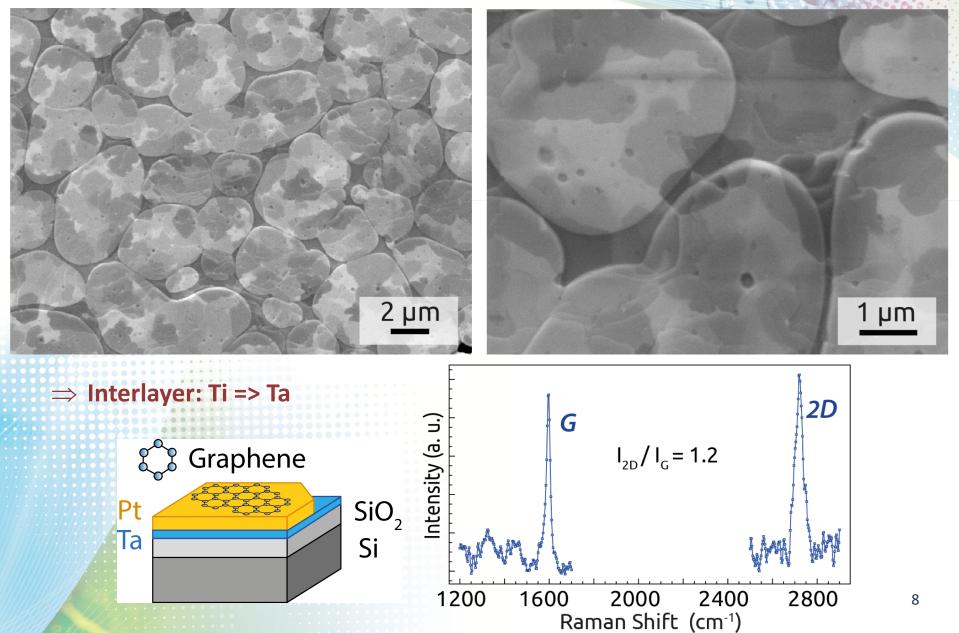

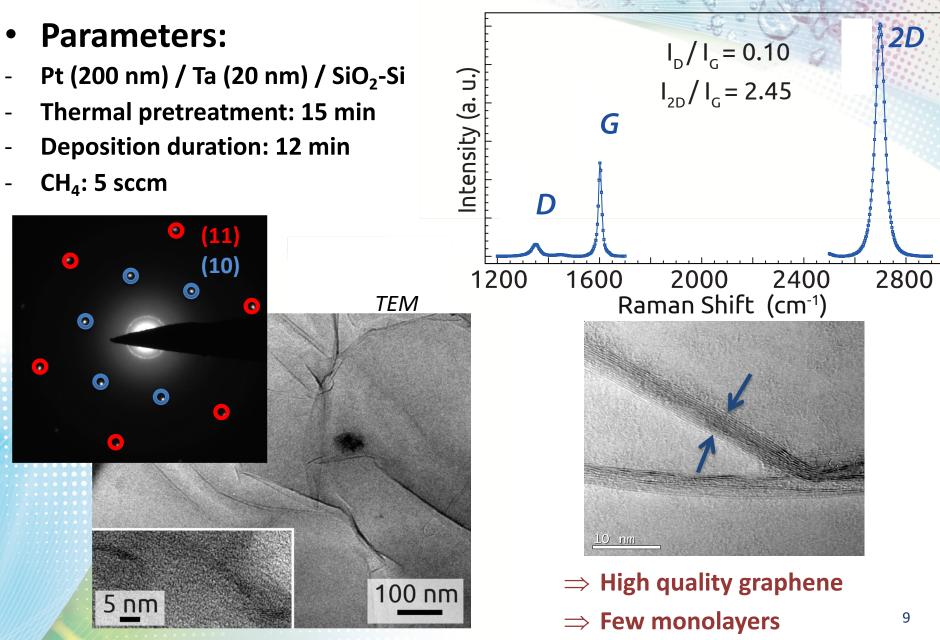
 $\Rightarrow$  Dewetting of the Pt thin film

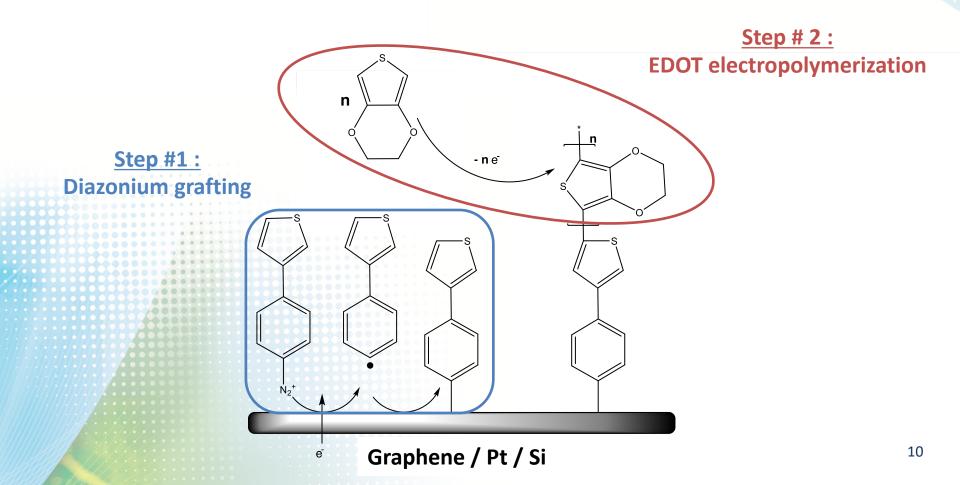

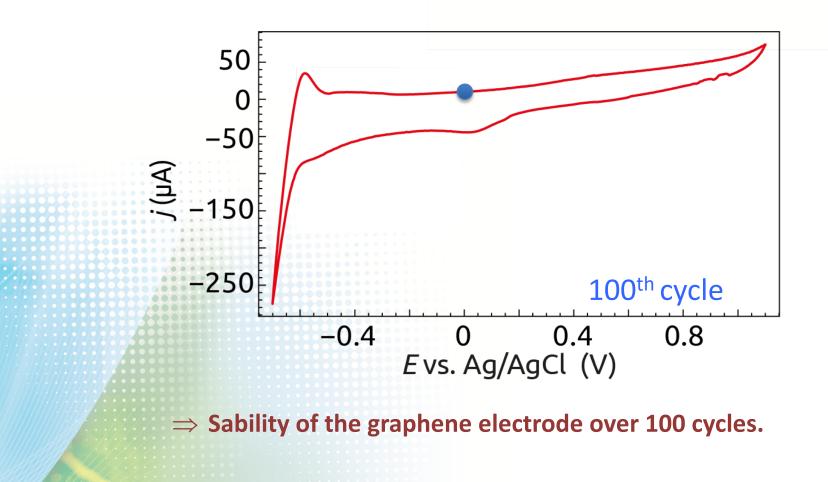


### **Graphene-based sensors**

- Graphene-based electrode functionalization:
  - Electro-grafting of 4-thiophenylbenzene diazonium
  - Electropolymerization of EDOT



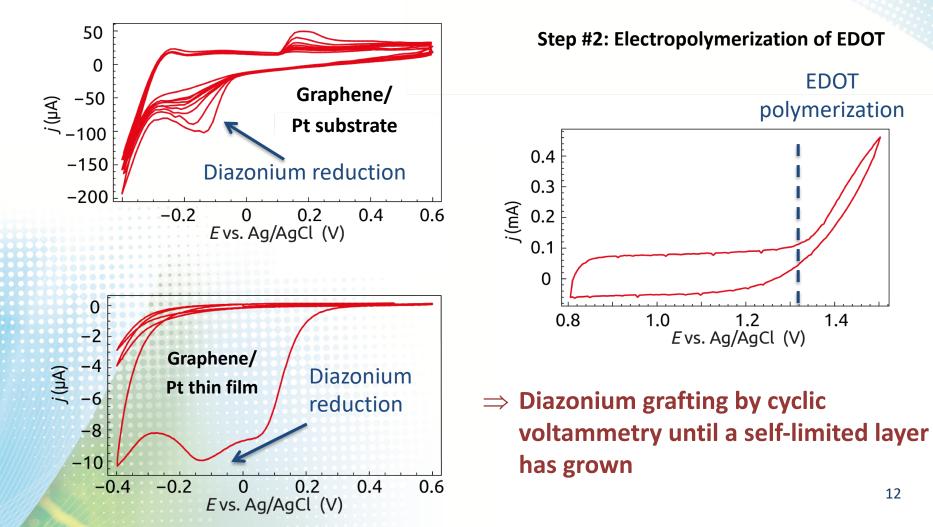
 Graphene-based electrode cycling in phosphate buffer electrolyte:



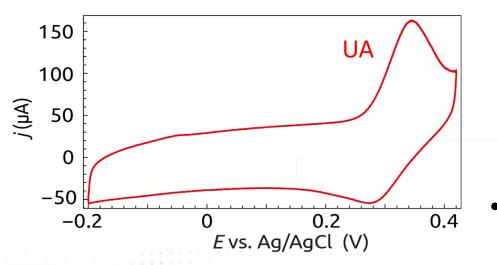
## **Graphene electrode**

#### Electrochemical functionalization

Step #1: Diazonium salt electrografting

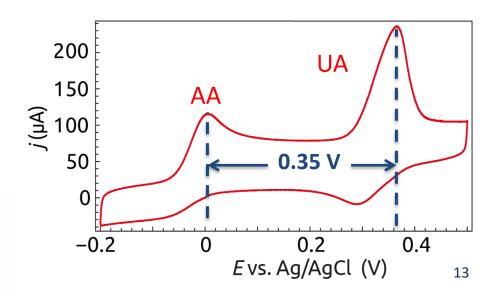


• Uric acid detection

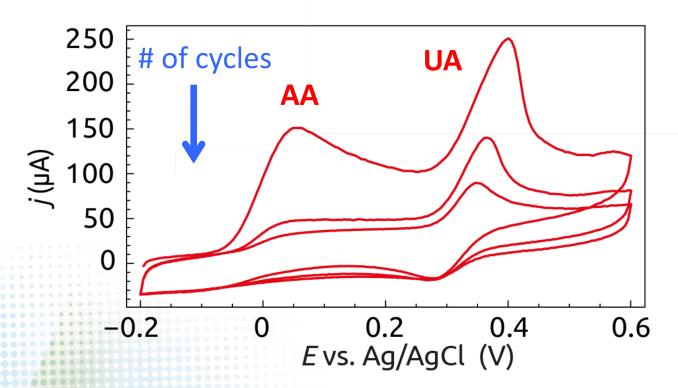


- $\Rightarrow$  High sensitivity and selectivity
- ⇒ UA and AA anodic peaks potential separation: 0.35 V
- ⇒ Detection at low overpotentials

- ⇒ Well-defined oxidation wave attributed to UA signal
- $\Rightarrow$  Limit of detection 200  $\mu M$
- Simultaneous detection of uric acid and ascorbic acid



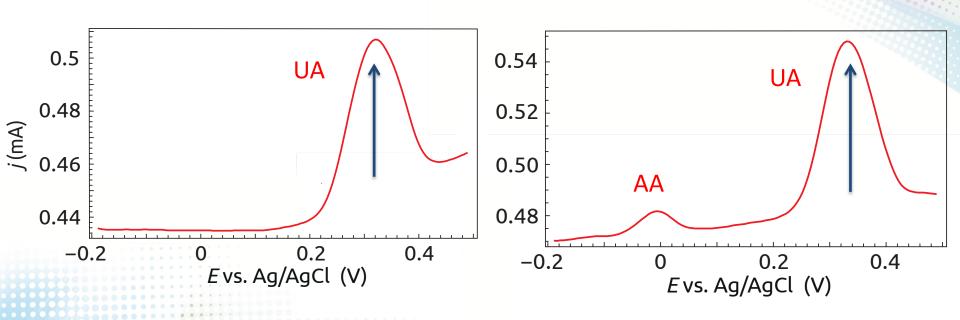
Simultaneous detection of uric acid and ascorbic acid:



- $\Rightarrow$  High selectivity
- ⇒ Decreasing of the detection signal over time
- ⇒ Reactivation of the electrode by rinsing with ethanol

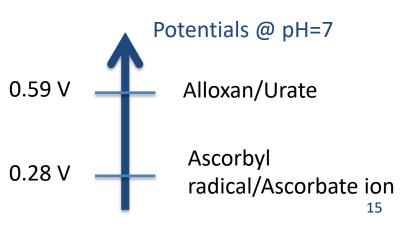
• Uric acid detection

Simultaneous detection of UA and AA



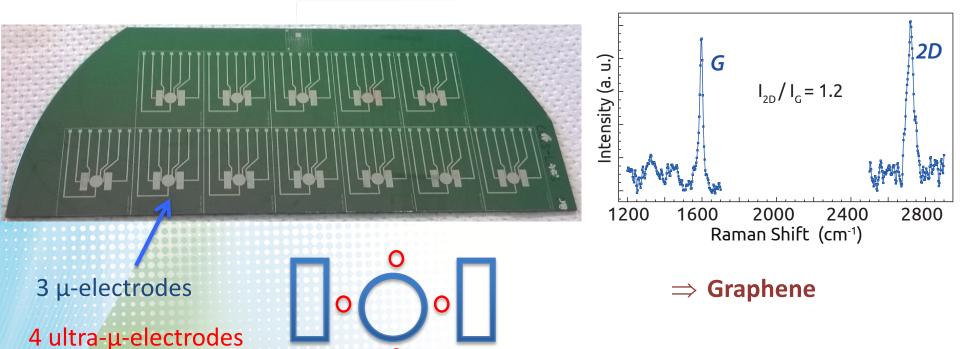
Enhancement of the UA oxidation wave while simultaneous detection of both UA and AA.

⇒ Spontaneous oxidoreduction reaction taking place between AA and UA oxidation products.



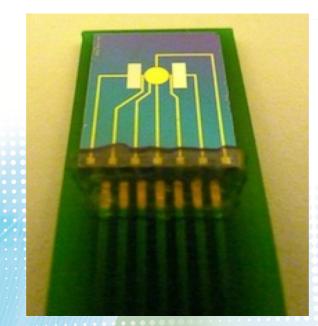
## Microdevices

- Integration of the graphene-based sensor in a microdevice:
  - Pt/Ta/SiO<sub>2</sub>/Si patterned substrate
  - Deposition of graphene (1040°C, AP, 15 min thermal treatment, 12 min deposition duration, CH<sub>4</sub>: 5 sccm)



### Microdevices

- Integration of the sensor in a microdevice:
  - Passivation of the electrode by Si<sub>3</sub>N<sub>4</sub>
  - Sensor integration into the final device



#### $3 \mu$ -electrodes + 4 ultra- $\mu$ -electrodes



 $\Rightarrow Up \text{ to 7 measurements on one chip}$  $\Rightarrow Electrochemical testing: in progress$ 

# **Conclusion and outlook**

- Synthesis of graphene on Pt thin films.
- Functionalization of the sensor by diazonium grafting and EDOT electropolymerisation.
- Integration of the electrode into a microdevice.
- Simultaneous detection of uric acid and ascorbic acid.
  - ⇒ Optimization of the graphene quality (doping)
    ⇒ Improvement of the limit of detection of the electrochemical sensors

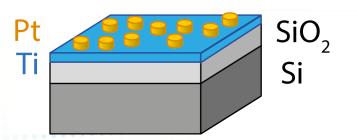

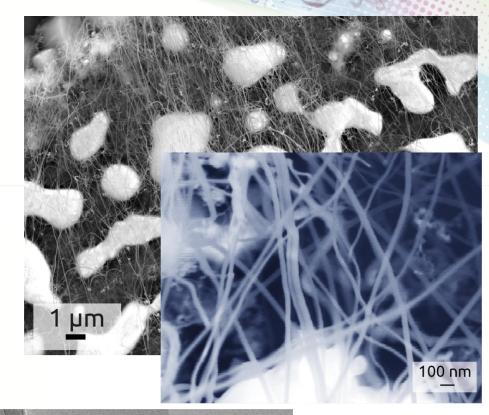
- Pt (200 nm) / Ti (20 nm) / SiO<sub>2</sub>-Si
- Thermal pretreatment: 15 min
- Deposition duration: 12 min
